PARTIAL LIFTING OF EXECUTIVE ORDER NOS. 32 AND 34: RESUMPTION OF WORK IN GOVERNMENT OFFICES WHILE MAINTAINING CLASS SUSPENSION DUE TO CONTINUING ADVERSE WEATHER FROM TYPHOON TINO

WHEREAS, Provincial Executive Order Nos. 32 and 34, Series of 2025, suspended classes and government work due to Typhoon Tino;

WHEREAS, Typhoon Tino has moved away from Negros Oriental and is forecast to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility by November 5-6, 2025;

WHEREAS, notwithstanding the foregoing, PAGASA has issued a Red Warning for Negros Oriental with more than 200 mm of rainfall expected through November 5, 2025, creating continuing threats of flooding and landslides;

WHEREAS, while conditions have improved sufficiently to resume government operations, the persistent heavy rains pose safety risks for students and school personnel traveling to and from schools;

WHEREAS, while the province as a whole is transitioning toward normalcy, some municipalities and cities have been severely impacted by the typhoon and may require continued suspension of government work to prioritize disaster response and recovery operations;

WHEREAS, the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council has determined that government offices can generally resume operations to restore essential services and facilitate post-typhoon recovery, while allowing local chief executives discretion in severely affected areas;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MANUEL L. SAGARBARRIA, Provincial Governor of Negros Oriental, by virtue of the powers vested in me by Presidential Executive Order No. 66, Series of 2012, Republic Act No. 12287, and other pertinent laws, do hereby order:

SECTION 1. GENERAL RESUMPTION OF GOVERNMENT WORK. Effective **November 5, 2025**, all government offices within the Province of Negros Oriental, including provincial, municipal, city, and barangay offices, shall resume normal operations. All employees are expected to report for duty.

SECTION 2. DISCRETIONARY SUSPENSION IN SEVERELY AFFECTED AREAS. Notwithstanding Section 1, mayors of municipalities and cities that have sustained severe damage or flooding from Typhoon Tino may, in their discretion and upon the recommendation of their respective Municipal/City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Committees, issue executive orders continuing the suspension of work in government offices within their jurisdictions.

SECTION 3. CONTINUED CLASS SUSPENSION. Classes at all levels in public and private schools remain suspended on **November 5, 2025**, due to anticipated continuing heavy rainfall and flooding threats.

This Order shall take effect immediately upon issuance.
